The team of 18 visited orphanages, villages and a church.



Hundreds waited for consultations.



Nurse Practitioner, Brett (with translator Guilene), consulted many children and adults.



Haitian-American doctor Daniel gives Kreyol New Testament to local voodoo priest. In total, **763** health/medical consultations were given: four days at a church in Sous Savanne and two days at New Life Center in neighboring Marechal.



Medications and vitamins were dispensed at the pharmacy table by nurse/team leader Peg McMunn and HFI staffer and nurse, Marianne Lako.



Holding an optical clinic was a first for Hope Force in Haiti. Joyce shows the various glasses.



Optician Sarah worked with the charts, and measured for reading and distance glasses. In the six days of clinic (at two locations), **347** people were consulted and received glasses.

Monsieur Cineus is 92 years old. He is almost blind and walked more than a mile to be seen by a doctor. At the consultation, it turned out that he needed -8.5 glasses. Miraculously, there was a pair with his prescription. He is a happy man!
